ADVENT PROCESSION WITH CAROLS

December 6, 2020 6 PM

In the old English liturgies, Advent services made a vivid preparation for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Much of Procession with Carols for an Advent Sunday is drawn from these old sources, and frequently the words of new carols have a similar antiquity. From the beginnings of Israel through the period of the New Testament and the Middle Ages, people took up the same language and used it afresh to speak of their own experiences. This Advent service draws on varied sources to express the expectations of God's people in many ages, as they prepare for Christmas. We therefore join together in this traditional ceremonial service of processions and carols, expectantly awaiting God's work anew.

Drawing from the models at King's College, Cambridge, England, choral music has been chosen to fit and comment upon the lessons to be read. The music has been chosen and the movements of the Chancel Choir adapted to fit the spaces and acoustics of First Palo Alto United Methodist Church. In the service, the procession moves from the semi-darkness at the Narthex to the light at the Chancel. From the darkness, which precedes the word of Creation in Genesis, our readings progress to the vision of the City of God, which has "no need of sun and moon to shine upon it, for the glory of God is its light and its lamp is the Lamb" (Revelation 21:23). Life apart from God is described as that of an arid desert place. But into this world enters God's mercy as rain, the "constant falling" of divine goodness, which transforms our lives and the world about us: the dew discovered in the morning becomes an image for the secret working of God's mercy. With the birth of a child, born in obscurity whilst the rest of the world was asleep, God intervened in history and gives real hope of lives continuously transformed from fragmentation to wholeness. Into the black despair that our world faces in an age of war, Christ brings light and hope. In this service, as in all of the Advent season, we recall the world's need for Christ's grace.

Come, Thou long expected Jesus Born to set Thy people free; From our fears and sins release us, Let us find our rest in Thee. Israel's strength and consolation, Hope of all the earth Thou art; Dear desire of every nation, Joy of every longing heart.

Born Thy people to deliver, Born a child and yet a King, Born to reign in us forever, Now Thy gracious kingdom bring. By Thine own eternal Spirit Rule in all our hearts alone; By Thine all sufficient merit, Raise us to Thy glorious throne.
