Following recent events, the current situation in Afghanistan has become a humanitarian crisis. The number of displaced Afghans, violence, & poverty are drastically rising. Children becoming orphans, families torn apart or on the run out of fear, child mortality rates are at their highest due to malnutrition, and no more easy access to healthcare—the consequences go on to be a heartbreaking nightmare of a life the Afghans are living through today.

Opportunities at Our Doorstep

Pastor's Discretionary Fund

This fund allows our pastor to confidentially provide assistance to members and community members in need. COVID-19's economic and employment impact on those most vulnerable is starting to appear. The federal subsidies and eviction moratorium stopped the hemorrhaging, however, those benefits have ceased, and we project that we will receive more requests for assistance. Typical requests: temporary housing, toiletries, shoes, coats, diapers, clipper cards, food, school application fees, Christmas toys, backpacks, and funeral assistance. Your continued generosity keeps our church known as a friend to the poor.

Coding Collaboratives

Coding Collaboratives is a group of students, parents, grandparents, professionals, and community supporters who work together for the good of teaching and inspiring our future technology professionals. Coding Collaboratives is open to students in the United States that are curious about technology. CC is driven by a belief that all students regardless of background or position can challenge themselves in a virtual classroom environment to have a functional knowledge of programming languages and understand the basics of computer security and project development. This is accomplished via a mentor, mentee relationship with stem professionals who have a strong interest in developing the minds of our youth. Each

student identifies and completes a project of their own choosing. Over the course of the semester, students engage in a combination of lectures and hands-on learning as mentors guide them towards project completion. Coding Collaboratives gives students in underserved communities an opportunity to engage in S.T.E.M. learning.

Ecumenical Hunger Program

EHP is a non-profit organization located in East Palo Alto. EHP aids local families and individuals who are experiencing economic and personal hardship, helping them regain stability and independence. EHP's holiday food program is a special distribution of food items for the holidays. These boxes include everything that a family might need to make Christmas dinner with plenty of leftovers for the following week. EHP also provides personal care packages to families struggling to secure everyday essentials such as soap, shampoo and toilet paper. At Christmas, gift cards are given to teenagers, who often serve a caretaker role in their families who cannot afford childcare.
